IV. SUBSIDIES

- Distribution of P1,000 cash aid to each Manila household following City Ordinance No. 8625 or the City Amelioration Cash Assistance Fund 2020
- Distribution of 506,758 food packs to families residing in Manila (as of 5:00PM, 23 May 2020)
- Procurement of 50,000 sacks of rice from NFA and distribution to each household at 3-kg quantity.
- Provision of rice and food packs subsidy to jeepney, e-trike, tricycle, and pedicab drivers
- Release of Php 3,000 financial assistance to all employees of the city government (regular, contract of service, JOs)
- Provision of Vitamin C for DPS personnel and other frontliners
- Donation of P4.7 million to PGH from the April salaries of the Mayor, Vice Mayor and City Councilors of Manila
- Provision of P5,000 cash assistance to all teaching and non-teaching personnel of public schools in the City of Manila
- Provision of Ensure milk food supplement to over 120,000 senior citizens in the City of Manila,
- Provision of relief goods to stranded construction workers
- Provision of cash and food assistance to stranded students in the city.
- Release of the senior citizen monthly city pension amounting to P1,500 from January to March 2020.
- Release of the PWD and solo parent monthly city pension amounting to P1,500 from January to March 2020.
- Release of the monthly allowance of PLM and UDM students

V. SOCIAL WELFARE

- Temporary housing for Street Dwellers at Delpan Sports Complex and San Andres Sports Complex
- Daily rescue of homeless and street dwellers
- Daily distribution of hot meals to street dwellers that are temporarily housed in Delpan Sports Complex and San Andres Sports Complex
- Repeal of City Ordinance No. 8565 which revokes the provision requiring senior citizens to be registered voters in order to receive P500 monthly allowance. Following the nullification of the

said provision, all senior citizens would only need a certification from their respective barangay in order to receive the monthly P500 allowance.

- Provision of financial assistance to Manileño families that were resettled in Tala, Caloocan
- Distribution of relief packs to Manileño families that were resettled in Naic, Cavite and Norzagaray, Bulacan
- Distribution of the second tranche of the City Amelioration Cash Assistance Fund amounting to P1,000 per household

VI. MEDICAL

- Procurement P116 million worth of PPEs (face masks, etc) and other medical equipment and supplies in support of the local government's anti-COVID-19 endeavors
- Establishment Manila Infectious Disease Control Center (MIDCC)
- Establishment Manila Emergency Operations Center (MEOC) with Online Health Consultation
- Creation of Digital Health Survey that monitors potential COVID-19 patients
- Installation of triage tents in 6 city-owned public hospitals
- Installation of hepa-filter machines in 6 city-owned public hospitals
- Provision of decontamination tents to 6 city-owned public hospitals and other establishments
- Daily transport assistance (e-trikes) for health workers
- Deployment of one bus each for 6 city owned hospitals
- Provision of acetate full face shields for health workers in the 6 city-owned public hospitals, private and national government hospitals, public markets, and other frontliners.
- Conversion of Delpan Evacuation Center to Quarantine area for mild cases of PUIs and PUMs
- Conduct of unhampered mass testing to suspected/probable cases and isolation of positive cases during hard lockdown in Barangay 20 Parola, Tondo, Tondo 1, and Sampaloc.
- Hiring of additional hospital/medical personnel
- Conduct swab tests and expanded targeted testing or rapid testing

VII. GOVERNANCE

- Continuous mobilization of Kadiwa Rolling Stores in partnership with the Department of Agriculture and other private companies
- Installation of disinfecting gates in strategic locations in the city
- Installation of sanitation tents in public markets
- Hotel accommodation for health workers from 13 hospitals in Manila with the support of hotels, motels, apartments, and dorms located in the city
- Citywide disinfecting and misting operations
- Passage of a resolution granting moratorium to all market stallholders within the city of Manila, public and privatized, from paying their rents for the duration of ECQ
- Appeal in writing to mall owners in the city of Manila to waive rental fees of establishments during the ECQ period
- Provision of Guide to Action against COVID-19 for all Barangay Chairmen
- Strict enforcement of curfew hours, anti-hoarding, and ECQ guidelines and protocols in the city
- Readiness of the City Council to provide legislative support for the initiatives of the Executive branch in the fight against COVID-19

- Mobilization of Manilans, local businessmen, conglomerates and concerned citizens to donate, procure and deliver PPEs for health workers, food and medicines for the people of Manila and hospital workers
- Continuous cleaning, declogging, and flushing operations around the city of Manila.
- Provision of training on COVID-19 protocols to volunteer health workers from Barangay 704
- Strict implementation of physical distancing in public places like markets
- Strict regulation of the businesses in Divisoria
- Provision of 'passing mark' this semester to all students of the Pamantasan ng Lungsod ng Maynila 'in recognition of the extremely serious impact of COVID-19' on their academic life.
- Painting of visual cues in order to strictly observe physical distancing
- Issuance of show cause order against barangay officials over alleged irregularities in the distribution of relief assistance and allowances amid COVID-19.
- Launch of www.mayorofmanila.ph. The website containing all official information on the city's comprehensive response to COVID-19.
- Partnership with FoodPanda in providing jobs to displaced tricycle drivers under the project PandaTODA
- Installation of inflatable isolation tents in San Andres Sports Complex.
- Distribution of food to hospitals, health centers, police stations, and other frontliners
- Gathering of all public school principals for the distribution of hygiene kits and relief packs to around 275,000 students
- Close coordination with the transport group and the Manila business sector
- Launch of online payment system for all taxes
- Construction of 12 quarantine facilities with 480-bed capacity

VIII. INFORMATION DISSEMINATION

- Daily release of COVID-19 updates
- Posting of 2,000 pcs of tarpaulin infographics about coronavirus disease and how to avoid contracting it.
- Massive information dissemination on social media and other forms of media
